FUTURES FAIR

PREPARATION BEFORE THE FAIR

- Review companies, sectors and additional expertise (see follow-up email)
- Note exhibitors of particular interest
- Aim to make a good first impression – being friendly, positive, and interested is a winning combination (handshakes can be a plus)
 - Ask questions and listen

AFTER THE FAIR

- Follow-up on any contacts
- Discuss the Fair experience with your tutor

- Explore a few of their websites
- Prepare a few questions

AT THE FAIR

- Think about possible next steps (follow-up actions re: learning more or Work Exp.)
- Record details on your Futures Fair Card
- Keep exploring

EXAMPLE QUESTIONS YOU MIGHT ASK:

Can you tell me about [Company's] products / services / recent news?

What do you like about [Company]?

What's your favourite thing about your job?

What do they most enjoy about working for this company? What are the challenges?

What kind of person is most successful at [Company]?

What is the company culture like?

[x] is really important to me. How do you support [x]?

What early career roles are you recruiting for?

What academic subject areas are you targeting?

What competencies/skills do you look for?

What positions at your company would be a good option for someone who...?

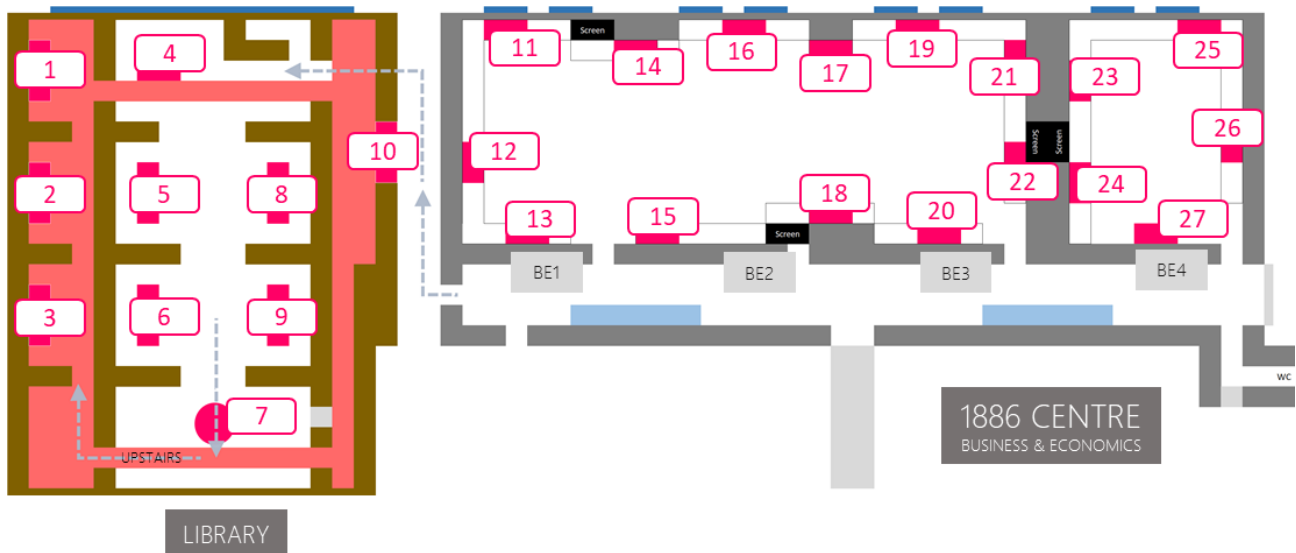
What does the recruitment process look like?
